The Zachary Foundation was established in July 2004 to engage in fundraising for physicians and organizations researching Mitochondrial Disease. Michael and Rhonda Friedberg, parents of Zachary Friedberg, founded the organization.

Michael is a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives and has been a hlny member since 1997. Zachary is affected by a rare form of Mitochondrial Disease. This disease affects his body's ability to convert sugar into energy and damages the cells of the heart, skeletal muscles, brain, liver, kidney and respiratory systems. Zachary's life expectancy is shortened due to the expected progression of the disease. Treatment consists of attempting to alleviate as many of the symptoms as possible and slowing down the progression of the disease through a special diet, but there is NO CURE for Mitochondrial Disease – YET. It is the goal of The Zachary Foundation to raise money and awareness of the disease to aid in finding a cure.

John E. Sciortino, FACHE *Senior Vice President and Chief Operating Officer*, New York Hospital Queens

John E. Sciortino, a Fellow in the American College of Healthcare Executives, was appointed Senior Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of New York Hospital Queens in January 1997. New York Hospital Queens is a 489-bed, acute care teaching and research hospital.

During his tenure as Chief Operating Officer, the hospital has added clinical capabilities such as open-heart surgery and expanded the hospital's clinical research activities and graduate medical teaching programs.

In February 2007, New York Hospital Queens broke ground on a \$200 million hospital modernization project. The project includes the construction of a new hospital wing that will add more patient beds, and make way for new ambulatory surgery facilities, interventional procedure rooms and numerous enhancements on the main campus.

Mr. Sciortino earned his M.B.A. from Hofstra University in 1977, and achieved his bachelor's of science degree in management from St. John's University in 1973.

He began his administrative career at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital/Cornell Campus (then named New York Hospital/Cornell Medical Center) in July 1973. In 1982, he was appointed the associate executive director of the Forbes Regional Health Center in Monroeville, PA. Mr. Sciortino was later appointed to Administrator and CEO of the Miners Hospital in Spangler, PA, a Forbes Health System member hospital.

In 1985, he returned to NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital, where he remained for a total of 21 years and served in several administrative positions.
